GRAVEYARD UPDATES

BARNET/ PETER, MAIDENCREEK TOWNSHIP

We are currently searching for photographs of the Barnet/Peter graveyard that show this location prior to being vandalized. Many of the stone fragments from when the tombstones were vandalized have been retrieved. If the tombstones are able to be reconstructed, we would like to reset them in their original location.

Maintenance work on the walls involving chipping and re-pointing is complete. We are soon going to be removing a tree that is actually causing the back wall to curve.

This graveyard was recently "adopted" by Paul Schumann. BCAGP has several graveyards in need of adoption. Please contact us if interested.



NEIN, OLEY TOWNSHIP

BCAGP members have been working hard to keep the Nein graveyard well maintained. In addition to being cleared of weeds, flowers were recently planted along the wall. We also cleaned the tombstones and reset a footstone that had sunk into the ground.

DETURK#2, OLEY TOWNSHIP

We finished rebuilding one wall at the DeTurk graveyard. With the assistance of donations, we are hoping to rebuild a second wall in the future.

We recently sprayed a gentle biocide on the tombstones at the Knabb graveyard to make the stones more legible without causing any damage. The Wisniewski family does an excellent job taking care of this graveyard and has offered to follow-up if a second spraying is required.

Our next task will be repairing some of the tombstones.
